

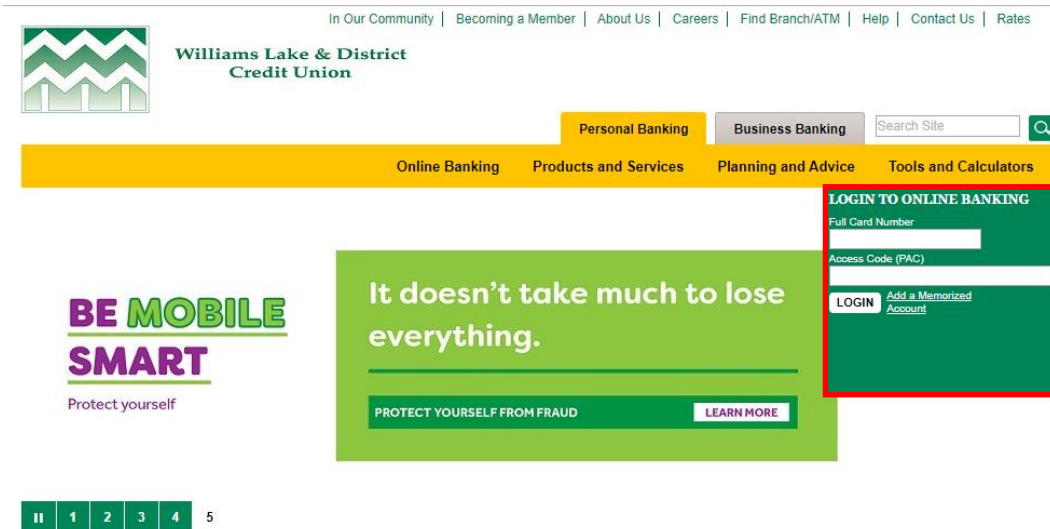
# Account Information

## Available through Online Banking

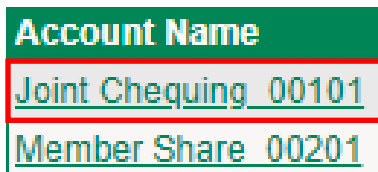
Are you tired of having to come into a branch to get your account information for pre-authorized debits or deposits? We're happy to tell you that you can now access this information through online banking!

Here's how to find the information:

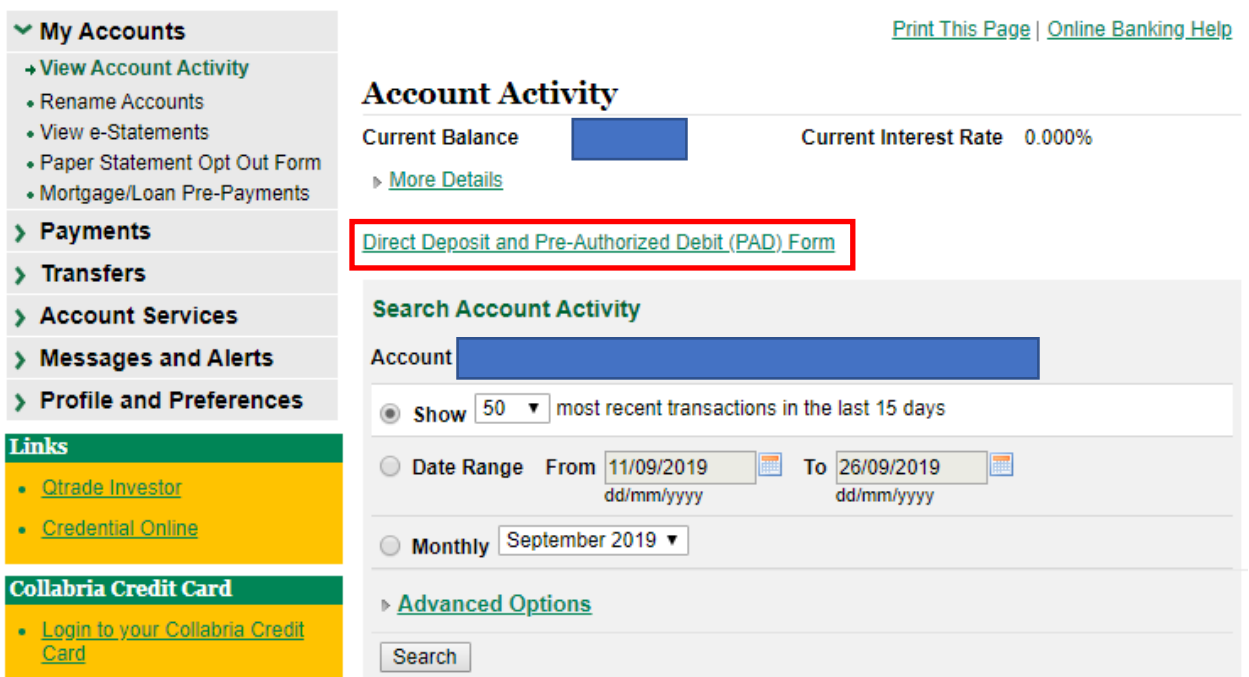
1. Navigate to our website (<http://www.wldcu.coop>) and login to online banking: (NOTE: this information cannot be accessed via the mobile app or mobile site)



2. Click on the account for which you'd like the account information:




3. Click on "Direct Deposit and Pre-Authorized Debit (PAD) Form" near the top of the screen:
